

Old unresolved guilt

Unless we have lived an unbelievably charmed life, none of us makes it even to adolescence without carrying the weight of previous mistakes. I once saw a cartoon of sorts that asked if we could choose between going back and fixing our mistakes or taking a payment of \$10 million, which would it be. For most of us it would be a difficult decision and not a few would forego the cash in favor of cleaning up our past.

We see this same regret with St. Paul. In 1 Corinthians 15 we have the Apostle's teaching on the end times, the final judgment, and the resurrection of the just. Within this context he laments,

"For I am the least of the apostles, not fit to be called an apostle, because I persecuted the church of God." For a real gut wrenching confession of St Paul's human weakness, read what he says about himself in Romans 7:15-25.

At the miraculous catch of fish, St. Peter drops to the knees of Jesus pleading,

"Depart from me Lord, for I am a sinful man."

In both cases, Sts. Peter and Paul both reflect upon their own sinful pasts and in their shame try to distance themselves from Jesus. In both cases Jesus does two things: First, He does not magically and miraculously make the shame go away. Second, He draws these two men even closer to Him and to His mission of inaugurating the Church to perpetuate His presence here on earth until He comes again.

Why not make the guilt go away? Jesus certainly could. Perhaps in His wisdom He lets us sit with our guilt as a not-so-subtle reminder not to repeat the behavior that caused the guilt in the first place. On our part we must make sure that we don't think that just because the guilt is still present that Jesus does not want us and that we are unable or unworthy to be disciples. The greatest people in the history of the Church such as St. Peter, St. Paul, St. Augustine, all lamented their pasts. Perhaps they never got over it and carried that remorse and regret their whole life long. But by the grace of God they pushed forward and continued to do His work the best they could. We are all the beneficiaries of their efforts and we are all called and required to do no less.

Gospel Meditation

My parents' garage is full of old junk that no longer serves any purpose in my life. As a 46-year-old man, I admit that's pretty lame. Either due to my sentimentality or laziness (or both, probably), I just couldn't get myself to throw things away. But a few days ago, by a grace of God, I thought, "I'll hire my nephew Ryan to throw a bunch of my stuff away — he couldn't care less about my junk!" And you know what? It worked. In one day, Ryan chucked the majority of his uncle's useless stuff. I feel so free, ready for a new junk-free chapter in my life.

This kind of thing happens in this Sunday's Gospel. Peter's net is full of useless junk. Luke says he and the others are cleaning their nets after catching no fish. Imagine them dejectedly and impatiently removing a nasty assortment of seaweed, sticks and muck. The Lord teaches and calls them once their nets are cleared out. So it goes with us. Spiritual life begins by removing that which is useless and merely taking up space in our hearts, minds and lives. Then Jesus teaches and acts in a marvelous way in our lives, too.

So what's junking up your net? What habits, attachments, possessions, preoccupations? If, like me, you struggle to clean your nets by yourself, ask the Lord to send you someone like my nephew to be your "Peter" and help you clean it out. It is well worth it. Once Peter's net is clean, he is free to make a wonderful catch.

It is edifying to see that people are really driven by a strong desire to attend Mass, but remember, if you fall and break a bone (or two!) you will probably miss many weeks or months of Masses as opposed to playing it safe and missing just one Mass if the weather is bad. One of the benefits of belonging to a community of faith is that if you cannot make it to Mass, the rest of us will pray for you! Also keep in mind that when the roads become icy and snow packed, the ministers to the homebound will not be going out to distribute Communion to our shut-ins.

Individual/Family Lenten Renewal

Lent begins in about a month. While there is no reason to start our observance of Lent until Ash Wednesday (March 5) it would be a good idea to start *planning* for Lent 2025 now.

A topic that Fr. Fred has floated to the Parish Council, Finance Council, Stewardship Commission, and the parish staff is that we at St. Joseph Parish should dedicate ourselves to:

The Renewal of Parish and Family Life by Reclaiming Sunday as the Lord's Day.

What does this mean? What does it look like? Quite simply we would all make a conscious and concerted effort observe the 3rd Commandment: *Remember to keep holy the Lord's Day*. We would quit using Sunday to catch up on chores, get a head start on shopping, or work on other duties. Instead, after attending Mass, we would spend time with family. Perhaps plan a Sunday brunch. Go to the lake or spend other time outdoors. Relax with some needed recreation. Take some time to reflect on our lives and our status before almighty God.

We need to ask ourselves if Sunday has been reduced to just another day of the week. Have we gotten lax in making it to Mass every Sunday and Holy Day of Obligation? This is an opportunity for true spiritual and family renewal that really only consists in doing what God calls us to do in the first place for our own good!

Lent will be here soon. Have you and your family wandered far from the original intention of the Sabbath Rest as outlined in the Scriptures? If so, start discussing now how your home might be renewed this Lent by reclaiming Sunday as the Lord's Day.




The Gift of the Mission

Everyday Stewardship

The First Reading from Isaiah describes a vision of the prophet in which angels surround the Lord. They proclaim, "Holy, holy, holy is the LORD of hosts! All the earth is filled with his glory!" Our God invites us to such deep intimacy and friendship with Him that we sometimes can forget just how majestic and unspeakably holy He truly is.

While we can approach Him with the confidence of a child before his father, we must also remember the deep reverence and awe that we owe to Him.

This sense of awe and reverence should motivate us to deepen our stewardship way of life as well. As we contemplate the holiness of God, we come to a heightened awareness of what a privilege it is that He has chosen to include us in His work of spreading the Gospel to others through the grateful sharing of the gifts He has given us. We can make the words of the prophet Isaiah our own: "Then I heard the voice of the Lord saying, "Whom shall I send" Who will go for us? Here I am, I said, send me!"

The theme of awe before God continues in the Gospel passage from Luke, where we again see the juxtaposition of a God who is so near to us, yet who is altogether holy and powerful. In this passage we find Jesus preaching to a crowd who is pressing in on Him to listen. (What an inspiring image! Do we "press in" as we listen to the readings proclaimed in Mass with this same sense of wonder and urgency?) In response, Jesus uses very ordinary means so that the crowd can hear Him. He simply gets into one of the nearby boats belonging to Simon so that His voice will better carry over the water. He finishes speaking and then tells Simon the fisherman to lower his nets for a catch. Simon is skeptical about this instruction but obeys, putting his fishing talents to use as Jesus asks.

The result is a catch of fish beyond Simon's wildest imaginings. Overwhelmed, he fell at Jesus' knees, "for astonishment at the catch of fish they had made seized him and all those with him."

When we truly embrace a stewardship way of life, putting our talents, time and treasure at the service of the Most High God, we, too, will be astonished at what God will do. Our lives may take a direction beyond our wildest imaginings.

But just as Jesus reassured Simon, "Be not afraid," He reassures us, too. We need not fear a stewardship way of life. Rather, we should embrace the adventure it presents us and prepare to be astonished by what our awesome God will do. "Here I am Lord, send me!"






