

PASTOR'S NOTES

~ Vatican II Misconceptions~

October 11, 1962 Pope John XXIII opened the much anticipated second Vatican Council. The opening of the council was a sign to many that the Church was listening to the world and in a sense getting with the program. In reality the council was intended to bring forward the tradition of the Church and speak in a manner that people in the modern world would be able to listen and come to know Christ more deeply. The desire was to speak to the problems in the modern world and do what the Church does; teach, sanctify, and govern.

The second Vatican Council was mainly intended to be a pastoral council and not doctrinal. The council's intent was meant primarily to promote the increasing of the faith, the renewal of traditions, and the updating of ecclesiastic discipline. Previously Ecumenical (Church) councils were held in order to solve a discrepancy in dogma. This council would be held to put for the engage the modern world with the truth of Jesus Christ and His Church.

Pope John XXXIII had a vision for the council.

Awareness – The Church is aware of itself **Renewal** – After we become aware we reform (note you

cannot reform what you don't know about)

Dialogue – Dialogue with the world at large.

This being his vision for the Council four major documents were put forth from the Council. These four major documents in Vatican II are called 'Constitutions'. One is on the liturgy, one is on the Church, one is on Revelation, and the last is on The Church in the Modern World. These four documents are the most important. But, there are others that are very important as well.

The Liturgy is the most public aspect of being a Catholic. The reform of the liturgy at Vatican II became the most visible change. There are many misconceptions as to what Vatican II did or didn't do to the Liturgy. Thus I would like to spend some time going through the Constitution of the Liturgy called *Sacrosanctum Concilium*. If you ever wonder how Church documents get their name it is from the first words or sentence in the document, *Sacrosanctum* means most holy and *Concilium* means council. Over the next weeks, and months I will walk through this document. I will offer a paragraph or section and give a brief explanation. The Liturgy is not only the most distinctive aspect of being Catholic, it forms our worship of God and thus is extremely important. This is why it is important for us to get it correct.

Let us open our minds and hearts to the word of our Church in these words of the documents of Vatican II and come to a deeper understanding of who we are as Catholics in our public worship that we may worship better together.

What else is there to give when one has already given away one's body and one's life? What more can one say or do to demonstrate love for another when all one had has been given to another? This total giving of self to loved ones cannot be trumped by flowery words or material gifts that are fleeting. This is the ultimate in love. This is the love Jesus had for us on the way to his Passion, at the institution of the Holy Eucharist. This is the love he has for us daily in the celebration of the Mass on altars in every church, in every city, in every nation on earth. No one can give more. No one can ask for more. This is the true heart of Christian stewardship.

If you take the time to gaze upon your God in the simplest of forms and begin to reflect on what has actually taken place with bread and wine becoming the presence of the Divine, then you can begin to understand true humility, sacrifice, and love. And when you have the privilege to take that Real Presence into your body at the meal where you are an honored guest, you become one with the One who is the embodiment of stewardship.

Then, you must ask yourself, "How can I even begin to reflect the love that I have encountered at this feast?" The answer is you can begin with the simple actions of the day: where will you go, whom will you meet, and in what work will you partake? Jesus Christ has shown that the greatest gift ever given can be disguised in this world in a piece of bread. By joining your body to his, he can now transform human hearts, not by grand acts, but by everyday acts, by everyday people, practicing Everyday Stewardship.

WHY DO WE DO THAT? Catholic Life Explained:

Mary and the Saints

Question:

Why do Catholics pray to Mary and the saints?

Answer:

One of the statements of faith we make when we pray the Nicene Creed and the Apostles Creed is that we believe in "the communion of saints." The Catechism of the Catholic Church reminds us that this communion (another word for community) includes all the faithful on earth, the souls in Purgatory, and the blessed women, men, and children who are in heaven. This teaching is grounded in our belief that, through Baptism, we are united with Christ and to one another with bonds that are stronger even than death.

And so from the time of the early Church, Christians have turned to other believers for prayers and assistance, including those who have gone before us, confident that God hears the prayers of all of His children. While we ask the saints (and one another) for prayers and support, we remember that the saints join us in prayer. But it is God who blesses and sanctifies us.

When we think of Mary and the saints in heaven, we have to remember that we can turn to them for intercession and assistance because they were faulted, limited human beings, just like us. This means that they are able to understand our struggles, doubts, fears, joys, and hopes. But as we learn their stories, we can also begin to recognize that they stand out in the history of the Church because they persevered in their commitment to follow Christ. Whether they were ordained, vowed religious, martyrs, husbands, wives, or even children, they show us that holiness is possible. We can not only follow their example but also benefit from their prayerful support.

Our devotion to the saints and gratitude for their witness, prayers, and protection should also be an inspiration for us, especially when we become aware of the needs of others or when others ask us to pray for them. We are called to share the blessings we receive. This is also part of our own journey of growing in holiness.

THE EUCHARIST

On feasts such as this, we recall miracles like the wedding feast at Cana or the multiplication of the loaves. Perhaps we remember the road to Emmaus, when Jesus was made known "in the breaking of the bread." In these stories, God satisfies our hunger in a supernatural way. But the cry of the human heart goes much deeper. "Man cannot live on bread alone," after all. In the Eucharist, God's supernatural presence takes the form of physical food. In the absence of physical nourishment, the body slowly begins to break down. Without an intentional pursuit of spiritual nourishment, our souls will similarly suffer. Our inner lives need rest and rejuvenation. We need daily connection with our Creator. We need to receive from the One who feeds us. The radical reality of the Eucharist speaks to our deeper aches, to the God who alone satisfies.
