

Pastor's Notes

Fr. Brian Lager

The Sacrament of Confirmation is a completion of the grace received at Baptism. Catechism 1285 says: "the reception of the sacrament of Confirmation is necessary for the completion of baptismal grace. For "by the sacrament of Confirmation, [the baptized] are more perfectly bound to the Church and are enriched with a special strength of the Holy Spirit. Hence they are, as true witnesses of Christ, more strictly obliged to spread and defend the faith by word and deed."

Sometimes we hear wrongly that Confirmation is where we begin to practice the faith for ourselves, or that we become an adult in the faith. Confirmation permanently marks our soul with an indelible mark and gives us grace to live out the faith. At baptism, we are infused with the theological virtues of faith, hope and love. At confirmation, the Bishop extends his hands in prayer over the confirmandi saying "All-powerful God, Father of our Lord Jesus Christ, by water and the Holy Spirit you freed your sons and daughters from sin and gave them new life. Send your Holy Spirit upon them to be their helper and guide. Give them the spirit of wisdom and understanding, the spirit of right judgment and courage, the spirit of knowledge and reverence. Fill them with the spirit of wonder and awe in your presence. We ask this through Christ our Lord." The candidates then proceed to the Bishop where he lays his hand upon them saying "Be sealed with the gift of the Holy Spirit." The candidate says "Amen." The Bishop continues, "Peace be with you." And the candidate responds, "And with your spirit." Meanwhile he anoints the forehead of the candidates with sacred Chrism which was blessed at the previous Chrism Mass at which the Bishop consecrated the oil.

Catechism 1151 says, "The sacraments are efficacious signs of grace, instituted by Christ and entrusted to the Church, by which divine life is to dispense to us." Catechism 1302-1303 says, "It is evident from its celebration that the effect of the sacrament of Confirmation is the full outpouring of the Holy Spirit as once granted to the apostles on the day of Pentecost.

From this fact, Confirmation brings an increase and deepening of baptismal grace.

- it roots us more deeply in the divine filiation which makes us cry, "Abba! Father!";
- it unites us more firmly to Christ;
- it increases the gifts of the Holy Spirit in us;
- it renders our bond with the Church more perfect;

• it gives us a special strength of the Holy Spirit to spread and defend the faith by word and action as true witnesses of Christ, to confess the name of Christ boldly, and never to be ashamed of the Cross:

Recall then that you have received the spiritual seal, the spirit of wisdom and understanding, the spirit of right judgment and courage, the spirit of knowledge and reverence, the spirit of holy fear in God's presence. Guard what you have received. God the Father has marked you with his sign; Christ the Lord has confirmed you and has placed his pledge, the Spirit, in your hearts."

The proper order of the sacraments of initiation is Baptism, Confirmation, and then Holy Eucharist. At one point Confirmation was part of the Baptismal rite. The Bishop was the main celebrant of these sacraments, but as the area the Bishop covered and the many sacraments were needing to be dispensed, they allowed priests to confer Baptism but kept the conferral of Confirmation as proper to the Bishop. A later age was chosen for the child to be Confirmed but also Holy Communion was not given until after Confirmation. When the age of reason was established, it was determined that once a child has attained the age of reason they could receive Holy Eucharist thus separating Confirmation from First Communion. The age of Confirmation is determined by the Bishop and thus has changed over the years.

Let us all recall our own Confirmation and renew our fervor to live and defend our faith handed on to us through the centuries by our Beloved Church instituted by Christ himself.

We congratulate these students who will receive this Sacrament of Confirmation from our Bishop at this weekend's 10:30 a.m. Mass.




STWARDSHIP RENEWAL FORMS

Since the boxes are being sent overseas, the Post Office will require you to fill out a Customs Declaration Form, it is a simple process.

DAY EIGHT (Wednesday March 18)



REVISED STATEMENT OF PENANCE, FASTING, ABSTINENCE

By Divine Law, penance is required of everyone. The Bishops of the United States remind us that, since we are not exempt from sinfulness, we should not consider ourselves exempt from penance. Pastors, teachers and parents of children should educate those under their care to a true sense of penitence.

Traditional forms of penance are: abstinence from meat, fasting from food, other practices of self-denial, acts of religion, (increased prayer life, participation in daily Mass and other devotions, spiritual and Scriptural reading), or other acts of charity and Christian witness.

THE CHURCH'S TEACHING AND DISCIPLE

regarding penance:

- ◆ **ABSTINENCE** means not eating meat. The obligation of abstinence begins at the age of fourteen (14) years.
- ♦ FASTING means eating only one full meal a day with the other two meals being without meat and together not equaling a full meal. The obligation of fasting begins at the age of eighteen (18) years or with the eighteenth birthday, and ends at the age of sixty (60) or with the sixtieth birthday.
- BOTH ASH WEDNESDAY and GOOD FRIDAY are days of both abstinence from meat and fasting, days of selfdenial and mortification.
- OTHER FRIDAYS OF LENT are days of abstinence from meat.
- ♦ OTHER FRIDAYS OF THE YEAR outside Lent are to be observed as days of penance, but each individual may substitute, for the traditional abstinence from meat, some other practice or self-denial.
- ◆ ALL WEEKDAYS OF LENT should be considered days of penance. A self-imposed observance of the traditional practice of fasting (allowing meat at only the full meal) is strongly recommended along with the other forms of penance mentioned above.
