

### **Pastor's Notes**

Sacrosanctum Concilium, The Constitution on the Sacred Liturgy, Vatican II, Series Part 13

24. Sacred scripture is of the greatest importance in the celebration of the liturgy. For it is from scripture that lessons are read and explained in the homily, and psalms are sung; the prayers, collects, and liturgical songs are scriptural in their inspiration and their force, and it is from the scriptures that actions and signs derive their meaning. Thus to achieve the restoration, progress, and adaptation of the sacred liturgy, it is essential to promote that warm and living love for scripture to which the venerable tradition of both eastern and western rites gives testimony.

25. The liturgical books are to be revised as soon as possible; experts are to be employed on the task, and bishops are to be consulted, from various parts of the world.

St. Jerome said "Ignorance of scripture is ignorance of Christ." The liturgy allows the scriptures to be publicly proclaimed every day that the Holy Sacrifice of the Mass is offered. As Catholics we ought to be steeped in Scripture, have a devotion to reading it everyday, praying with Scripture, take part in Bible Studies so that we find that deep love for the Word of God. The more that we know Scripture the more we understand who we are and where we are going.

The Second Vatican Council set forth from this document to reform the Sacred Liturgy in order to include more of the scriptures throughout the year. If Catholics attend Mass every Sunday, in three years they will hear 71.5% of the New Testament, and 13% of the Old Testament. If anyone ever accuses a Catholic of not reading Scripture, they may be surprised to know this. Let us take the initiative to get into the Bible and read the Word of God. Begin with the Gospel of Mark, it's the shortest Gospel, then go to the Acts of the Apostles. This is a great way to enter into the story of our Lord and the early Church He intended to found. The habit of daily scripture reading will open our eyes to a deeper knowledge and love of Jesus Christ whom we come to receive in Holy Communion at the Holy Sacrifice of the Mass.


Thomas More Prep-Marian Jr. / Sr. High School is seeking a full-time front office administrative assistant.

### ENCOURAGE DEEPER UNDERSTANDING OF SCRIPTURE

If I work for five hours, I expect to get paid for five hours. If I work for two, I expect to get paid for two. What if we worked for a company that paid everyone the same amount regardless of how long they worked? How would we feel going home with the same pay for working eight hours as my co-worker did for working only two hours? Secular wisdom would have a huge problem with this and a visit to the Labor Board would quickly pursue. But this is God's wisdom and God's ways.

We sometimes think that if we pray more, better, or more fervently and go over and above with the practice of our faith, God will somehow reward us and present us with some kind of merit badge. We are so wrong. Spiritual practices have only one true purpose: to deepen our love for God. In deepening our love for God, we also increase our ability to see God's presence around us, living life more purposefully and contemplatively. What if God chooses to treat someone who has come on the scene of faith later in life the same as someone who has devoted their whole lives to it? Does it really matter? If we have the merit badge notion of faith, we can find ourselves feeling a little arrogant and even jealous of folks who have not followed the same path that we have. We can even see ourselves as the privileged few who have a corner on the faith and fully possess it.

That thinking doesn't square with God. God is all about mercy in abundance and is ready to take anyone to himself regardless of when they come. He is only happy that they have come home and delights in their return. After all, if you really and truly love someone, does it matter what they will give you in return or what

you receive as a benefit? If relationships were assessed based upon productivity, they would lack authentic love. We invest too much self interest in our prayer and neglect to see it as an opportunity to pursue our Lover and deepen the intimate bond we have with God.

When we breathe our last, all that is of consequence is union with God. If my love for God is real, I am going to want to live the Gospel, abide by the commandments, practice my faith, forgive and love my neighbor, and care for the environment, regardless of how much time it takes or benefits me. We want God to think and behave as we do, and in doing so, we set ourselves up for disappointment. God has a totally different agenda and that's okay.


#### **Good and Evil**

**Question**: If God is good, why is there evil in the world?

Answer: The problem of evil is perplexing. If God is all-powerful and all-good, why doesn't He stop bad things from happening? He must either not be all-powerful, or perhaps He's not very good after all. Human beings have faced the possibility of evil since the very beginning of our existence. In granting us free will, God gives us the ability to make free choices. God does not force us into moral perfection. We are not forced to love Him or to love our neighbor. We must make the decision ourselves. This means, of course, that we have the ability to choose against love.

One small decision of selfishness, jealously, or pride may not seem so bad. But every decision — good or bad — is like a stone dropped into a still pond. The ripples extend much farther than the original stone. When decisions against love begin to compound, they affect families, neighborhoods, and nations. This is all the more reason for Christians to be faithful to our baptismal call to love one another as Christ has loved us! ©LPi

Uncertainties: A few Sundays ago, the opening prayer stated, "that, amid the uncertainties of this world, our hearts may be fixed on that place where true gladness is found." Where is true gladness found amid the uncertainties of this world? True gladness is found by keeping Jesus at the center of all we do. It is putting our faith in Jesus, and committing one's entire self to Him, not in some idea or latest trend. It is putting our hope in Jesus as we desire the kingdom of heaven and eternal life as our happiness. It means loving Jesus and bringing His love to the world. Jesus is the Redeemer of the world who always brings good out of evil. I often say, "Jesus, I trust in you" throughout the day.

**Prayer**: "Let the storm rage and the sky darken - not for that shall we be dismayed. If we trust as we should in Mary, we shall recognize in her, the Virgin Most Powerful 'who with virginal foot did crush the head of the serpent.'" This powerful quote comes from Saint Pope Pius X. In light of the many evils that are occurring in our world and especially our country, I am inviting the faithful to join me in prayer and fasting from September 8 (the Blessed Mother's birthday) until November 21 (the Presentation of Mary in the Temple). Please join me in praying the rosary every day, fasting on Fridays and making a holy hour in front of the Blessed Sacrament at least once a month during the months of September, October and November. I appreciate your support and kindness. Jesus said that some evil can only be defeated by prayer and fasting. We live in a country where many people have rejected God. Prayer is the answer because with God all things are possible.

Acts XXIX: I also encourage you to join me in participating in a National Day of Prayer and Fasting on September 24, organized by the Apostolate Acts XXIX.

**New Director**: We are very blessed that Megan Robl is the new Executive Director of Catholic Charities of Northern Kansas. Megan started on August 24. She has been working with interim director Katie Platten in continuing the wonderful service of Catholic Charities to the least among us. They are continuing to expand their mobile outreach so that they can reach more and more people in our diocese to provide food and other items. Thank you for your generosity and support of Catholic Charities!

Political Scene: The upcoming election is set for Tuesday, November 3. Please vote, but please do so with an informed conscience. The Congregation for the Doctrine of Faith stated that, "a well-formed Christian conscience does not permit one to vote for a political program or an individual law that contradicts the fundamental contents of faith and morals." (please read Doctrinal Notes on Some Questions Regarding the Participation of Catholics in Political Life, #4). Some things, such as abortion, is always morally wrong. The Church doesn't say this to condemn anyone. The Church says this to stand for truth, which leads to the happiness and good of the human person and all of society.

More than just a "good read": If you want more information on voting, please read <u>Doctrinal Notes on</u> <u>Some Questions Regarding the Participation of Catholics in Political Life</u> by the Congregation for the Doctrine of the Faith. One of my favorite quotes from that document is, "At the same time, the Church teaches that authentic freedom does not exist without the truth. **Truth and freedom either go together hand in hand or together they perish in misery.** In a society in which truth is neither mentioned nor sought, every form of authentic exercise of freedom will be weakened, opening the way to libertine and individualistic distortions and undermining the protection of the good of the human person and of the entire society."

Choose Life or Death: October is Respect Life Month. Saint Teresa of Calcutta said it so well: "The greatest destroyer of love and peace is abortion, which is war against the child. The mother doesn't learn to love but kills to solve her own problems. Any country that accepts abortion is not teaching its people to love, but to use any violence to get what they want. We must not be surprised when we hear of murders, killings, of wars, or of hatred...If a mother can kill her own child, what is left but for us to kill each other?" In summary, Saint Teresa is telling us we should not be surprised when we see so much violence in our world. The root of the problem is killing the unborn and the loss of the respect for the dignity of every human person. Please join me in praying for the end of abortion. Also, please pray that all people involved with abortions may experience a conversion and experience God's healing mercy.

Mercy: I am thrilled that <u>Divine Mercy Radio</u> is now in Salina. I listen to it frequently and learn something new every time I do. They are having their fundraising banquets on Sept. 12 in Hays and Sept. 13 in Salina. I hope to see you there. Thank you for your support of Catholic radio in our diocese.

**COVID**: I've asked our priests to continue to have a dialog with their local health officials on advice for Masses regarding masks, etc. Thank you for your patience and trust during this time.

**Schools**: There were a few hiccups along the way, but so far, our Catholic schools are moving forward with in-house classes. I am so grateful for all the administrators and teachers as well as the parents and students who are walking with faith.

**Seminarians**: Thank you for your continued generosity and support for our seminarians through the seminarian dinner, seminarian collection and beyond.

Fatima movie: Hope you can watch the new movie on Fatima that has recently come out. There are some movie theatres that are showing it, but you can also watch it online (though there is a cost involved). 
**Labor Day**: Blessings to all of you on this Labor Day weekend. I hope all of us make time to rest from our



#### Adoration

Adoration before the Blessed Sacrament draws the worshiper into spiritual communion with God. Whether done on one's own time or at a scheduled service, adoration of the eucharistic presence of Christ fosters our devotion for participation in the Mass.

Jesus instituted the Eucharist for our eating and drinking. Sharing communion at Mass brings us nourishment, healing and sustenance. There is no substitute for participation in the Eucharist; adoration should enhance it, not replace it.

Catholics reserve leftover communion breads in a tabernacle. The primary purpose for this custom is to have the Body of Christ ready for the dying at any time. The tabernacle also provides communion for the sick or those unable to come to Mass. Because it houses the sacramental Body of Christ, it serves as a place for adoration.

Adoration may be private or public. When adoring the Blessed Sacrament in private, Catholics usually go to any church, where the communion hosts are kept inside the tabernacle. They say whatever prayers they wish. Public adoration may take place in the context of a brief service (traditionally called "Benediction" although that only refers to the blessing which concludes it) or over a more extended period of time. The Blessed Sacrament is usually presented for adoration outside the tabernacle on an altar or a stand.

Extended periods of adoration used to be common. They filled the void for people who were not receiving communion frequently. However, in the twentieth century, the church urged people to more frequent communion and has forbidden exposition during Mass. Participation in the Eucharist at Mass accomplishes spiritual communion more perfectly and renders simultaneous adoration unnecessary. Prolonged periods of adoration may happen in church where a large number of the faithful are gathering and when the bishop has given his approval. If Mass is celebrated, the Blessed Sacrament should be returned to the tabernacle.

Whether the Blessed Sacrament is inside or outside the tabernacle, adoration may invite us into prayer and prepare us for the Eucharist.




