Sunday, the Day of the Lord

Sunday is the original festival, the weekly celebration of Christ's holy resurrection. Sunday is the day of the Eucharist, the day of the Church's joy, the day of beginning again in the grace of Him who says, "Behold, I make all things new" (Rev 21:5). The festivity of Sunday worship overflows into all of life. There is delight in the details: freshly polished shoes, "Sunday best" clothes, flowers and wine for the Sunday dinner table.

Allowing Sunday Mass to become one thing among others on a weekend checklist leads to a loss of "Eucharistic amazement." Holy Mass is Sunday's central event. All other things are arranged around it. The absolute priority given to Sunday Mass is an irreplaceable witness to the Kingdom God.

The beauty of Sunday Mass is an offering to God and a healing for the soul. The singing of priest, deacon, cantor, and people, the use of incense and lights, the sacred movement of bodies in worship, vesture in the appointed liturgical colors, the clear sound of the bell, the flowers that delight the eye and perfume the air — all these good things proclaim the splendor of the Mystery of Faith, each in its own way.

In addition to Sunday Mass, following an impetus given by the Second Vatican Council, there are cathedrals and parish churches around the world where the faithful return for Vespers, the Church's solemn evening liturgy. The celebration of Vespers is often followed by a time of Eucharistic adoration. Having entered into Christ's sacrifice in the morning, the Church returns at sunset to contemplate the glory of his Face, praying, "Stay with us, for it is toward evening and the day is now far spent" (Lk 24:29).

Pastor's Notes

"Loving Our Enemies"

Certainly one of the unique teachings of Jesus was His requirement that His followers would love their enemies. In our Gospel reading today, Our Lord couches this teaching in a number of rhetorical questions:

For if you love those who love you, what credit is that to you? Even sinners love those who love them. And if you do good to those who do good to you, what credit is that to you? Even sinners do the same. If you lend money to those from whom you expect repayment, what credit is that to you? Even sinners lend to sinners, and get back the same amount."

Then He hits us with His direct exhortation:

But rather, love your enemies and do good to them, and lend expecting nothing back; then your reward will be great and you will be children of the Most High, for he himself is kind to the ungrateful and the wicked. Be merciful, just as your Father is merciful.

The act of loving our enemies sounds like it simply goes against our nature. But there is an ancient Japanese parable that perhaps sheds some light on the matter. In the days of the Shogun Warriors there was a warrior king who had had enough of a neighboring kingdom. He sent one of his warriors with other soldiers with strict orders to destroy all of his enemies. After some days the warrior king went to the neighboring territory to see how his orders had been carried out. While expecting to come upon the main city seeing it in smoldering ruins, he was aghast to find flags and banners flying and the whole town in the middle of a great celebration. He found his chief warrior laughing and feasting with king whom he so desperately wanted to see dead. Enraged, he bellowed to his chief warrior, "Why did you not follow my orders???!!" The warrior responded, "My lord, I followed your orders exactly. You told me to get rid of your enemies. I did. They are now our friends."

The Book of Proverbs 25:21-22 advises us:

*If your enemy is hungry, give him food to eat;
if he is thirsty, give him water to drink.
In doing this, you will heap burning coals on his head,
and the LORD will reward you.*

St. Paul cites this teaching in Romans 12:17-21:

*Do not repay anyone evil for evil.
Be careful to do what is right in the eyes of everyone. If it is possible, as far as it depends on you, live at peace with everyone. Do not take revenge, my dear friends, but leave room for God's wrath, for it is written: "It is mine to avenge; I*

will repay," says the Lord. On the contrary:

*"If your enemy is hungry, feed him;
if he is thirsty, give him something to drink.
In doing this, you will heap burning coals
on his head."*

*Do not be overcome by evil,
but overcome evil with good.*

In short, the purpose for loving our enemies is to turn them into our friends so that we can all one day be reunited around God's table in heaven as His family. It is not easy, but God's grace makes it possible by helping us to see the bigger picture .



QUESTION: I noticed in Mass one day that people do different things. Some change responses, some genuflect before Communion, and one lady went to kneel in front of the tabernacle. Are these part of the new changes that are coming?

ANSWER: People have good intentions, and try to do what they feel is best as they worship God. When things are too "liberal" or too "conservative," depending on their personal preferences, people will try different things. And so, you get all kinds of bowing, genuflecting, changing of responses, elimination of masculine pronouns, etc. I have actually seen people fall because the person in front of them suddenly genuflects before Communion, which is not part of our tradition. The bishops continue to address these issues, requiring some uniformity, while leaving room for appropriate individual expression.

In the meantime, it is important to remember that we gather as a community to celebrate the Eucharist. We are the body of Christ, united in mind, heart and spirit as we worship God. When people do things that are distracting, or different than the rest of the community, it introduces a foreign element and breaks the unity of the assembled church. Strictly speaking, that is a definition of sin: a rupture in our relationship with God and one another. Not that these things are sinful, but the higher value is the community at worship-the "common unity" rather than political or religious statements of individuals. Good intentions do not replace good liturgy!

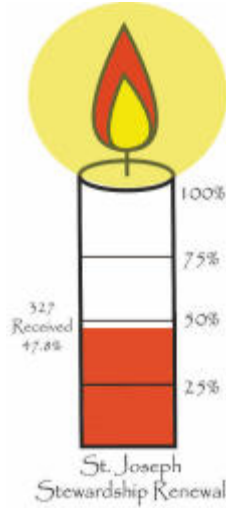

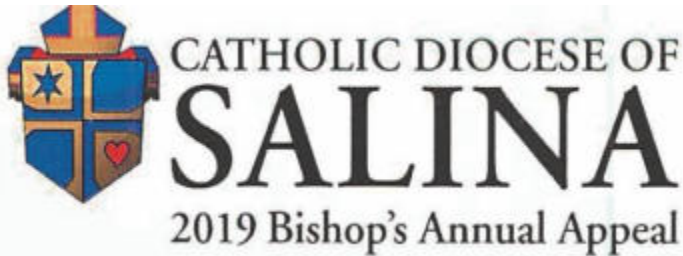
STEWARDSHIP RENEWAL FORMS

St. Joseph registered parishioners should have received their Stewardship Renewal Forms (SRF) along with their Tithing information in January. Please look over these forms for any additions, changes, or corrections. If you are continuing your ministry/ministries, you need to check the box next to your current ministries. If you no longer want to continue, leave the box empty.

We have noticed that many of the Stewardship forms did not have all of current ministries listed on the family form. If this is the case with you, please write in the number of the ministry that you want to continue with, or add a new one, or check the box of those listed on the sheet.



As of February 19, out of the 684 stewardship renewal forms that were sent out in January, 327 have been returned, which is 47.8% of the parish.



ALLOCATION OF GIFTS

- ◆ SEMINARIANS: \$363,000.00
Supports the education and religious formation of men preparing for the priesthood. Currently 12 seminarians are in varying stages of formation from our diocese. Gifts help with academic study, then pastoral service during the summer months.

WHO IS IN THAT WINDOW AT ST. JOSEPHS

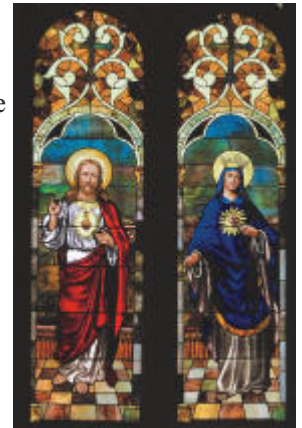

Over the past few months we had a number of people ask to have the articles written by Fr. Gilmary on the windows in the church. These articles were written in 2007 while the windows were all going through a restoration.

Today we continue with the window of Sacred Heart of Jesus and Mary, but take a look at the upper rose window.

On the rose window above both figures is one single crown. I am guessing that the artist put that there because, being a good theologian, he did not want Christ to be without a crown along side of Mary, who is wearing one. But the Sacred Heart is never crowned. So Jesus' crown is up above in the rose window.

Visitors to the church are always struck by this window. They like the deep colors, the red and blue, which stand out. And people have pointed this out. At night, when most of the lights of the church are not on, that window is especially beautiful because a street light shine directly in, picking up these colors.

GOSPEL REFLECTION

This Sunday, Jesus continues his challenging Sermon on the Mount. "Love your enemies, do good to those who hate you, bless those who curse you, pray for those who mistreat you? Give to everyone who asks of you, and from the one who takes what is yours do not demand it back." Words like these are challenging! Many of us have grown up in a culture of independence and retaliation against those who harm us. Today's Gospel reminds us that the way of the world is not necessarily the way of the disciple.

In many spiritual texts, saints describe the first stage of the spiritual life as mercenary love of God. That is, we love Him because he "pays" us with graces and good things. Consider for a moment, why do you do the good that you do? Take volunteering, for example. How often do we talk about the good feelings service evokes and how you "get so much more than you give." This is still based on an attitude of return on our investment. Would we volunteer if we knew it was good to do, but we didn't "feel" good afterward? What if the people we helped seemed ungrateful, or if someone at the food pantry stole \$20 out of our purse? It can be difficult to love people when we think we might not get anything back. "For if you love those who love you, what credit is that to you?"

As Christians, we are called to imitate God. We follow a God who loves not only His closest friends, but who loves betrayers, deniers, and crucifiers. The Christian walk is one of perseverance and sacrifice. What does your love look like?

As you enter St. Joseph sacred space, please...



- ◆ Shut off your cell phone.
- ◆ Do not bring any food or drinks (bottled water, soda, coffee, etc.) into Mass or to other activities such as weddings, wedding rehearsals, funeral vigils, funerals, etc.
- ◆ Observe a prayerful silence before and after Mass out of respect for God's Presence and those who are in prayer.
- ◆ Put your gum in the trash, not under the pew.

EVERYDAY STEWARDSHIP

I sometimes spend more money than I should. I make decisions based upon my wants and not my needs. Those actions can create a financial difficulty or circumstance where more sacrifice is needed. Instant gratification or selfish impulses can create havoc in one's bank account, marriage, or family. All these issues to deal with simply because I wanted what I wanted and I got it. Yes, it sounds like the actions of a child.

However, I know I am not alone. We all can easily find ourselves acting in this manner. This is why it struck me to listen once again to the words of Jesus when he says, "Do to others as you would have them do to you." The words are reminiscent of another of Jesus' phrases, "Love your neighbor as yourself." The problem is that too often I would like for others to fulfill my wants instead of needs, and I can seemingly love myself by doing what I already mentioned above.

A stewardship way of life means that I wisely steward what I have, and I cannot give what I do not have. Have you ever given someone a present you couldn't afford and think that was love? It wasn't. We don't show love by giving what we do not possess. We show love by meeting another's needs and by sharing our very self with them. At our core, what we long for from others more than anything else is love. Would I have others give me lavish gifts and shower me with empty compliments or would I have them give to me something much more valuable: the love in their hearts? In turn, I need to love myself more by realizing that no purchase will offer fulfillment more than the love of God shown to me in Christ Jesus.
