

The myth of "Equality"

So-called "equality" is a myth and must be understood in a carefully nuanced way. To say that we are all equal is a delusion. We are not. I know many people who are smarter than I am. Others work harder than I do. Still others are simply better human beings than I am. We are not equal, and thank God for it!! I need others who are better than I am so that I have examples to follow and something to which to aspire. Perhaps the reason why so many people howl for equality is because for them it is an unearned promotion!

Now there is equality in the sense that we share an equal dignity as human beings. By virtue of the fact that we are all children of God created in His image gives us an equal dignity that means that our lives are sacred we have certain human rights.

Our culture is somewhat schizophrenic when it comes to its misguided emphasis on "equality." On the one hand it will insist that we are all equal, we are all the same, but then turn right around and demand that we "celebrate diversity!" How can one be "same" and "diverse" at the same time?

St. Paul tells us today that in the Church

To each individual the manifestation of the Spirit is given for some benefit. To one is given through the Spirit the expression of wisdom; to another, the expression of knowledge according to the same Spirit; to another, faith by the same Spirit; to another, gifts of healing by the one Spirit; to another, mighty deeds; to another, prophecy; to another, discernment of spirits; to another, varieties of tongues; to another, interpretation of tongues. But one and the same Spirit produces all of these, distributing them individually to each person as he wishes.

Instead of growling for "equality" we should instead marvel at the many gifts that the Holy Spirit lavishes upon the Church for the good of all. Not everyone is endowed with the same gifts or abilities, but all are given what God knows that we need to fulfill His will for the mission of the Church here on earth. Next week we will read from 1 Corinthians 12 about the various gifts that the Spirit bestows upon the Church. We may not think it is fair that some are given more than others, but none of us are God now, are we?

Gospel Meditation

A friend invited me to an invitation-only wine-tasting event. There were over two hundred varieties of wine. Having no idea how to approach such a massive selection, I wandered aimlessly among the tables, sipping this and that. At the end of the evening my friend asked if I had tried some of the exceptionally expensive wines. I hadn't. "The really good stuff disappears first," he said. "My man, you missed out on some amazing vino." I was so disappointed. I wasted my chance for amazing once-in -a-lifetime wine. The wine I tasted was, well, blah.

Don't we often feel a similar disappointment in life? I missed this or that opportunity. If only I had known. Optimism sputters and fades. The glory days are gone. The chances, it seems, for the really great things in life come and go so quickly. Then they are gone forever. The good stuff goes first. Then life is just blah.

Not so with the Lord Jesus. In Jesus' miracle at the wedding at Cana, the steward of the feast says, "Everyone serves good wine first, and then...an inferior one" (John 2:10). That's the natural downward progression of life. The good stuff disappears quickly. But he says of the groom (who symbolizes Jesus), "But you have kept the good wine until now." This is the everimproving trajectory of the realm of God's grace. With Jesus, the "good wine" of divine love, hope and peace gets better as our journey of faith progresses. Where are your greatest disappointments? Don't give in to the lie that the really good stuff is gone. Tell Jesus you've run out. Then learn how to taste that amazingly good wine, because he saves the best until now.

Characteristic Overview

The Christian steward lives life as a disciple of Christ. The U.S. Bishops state, "Following Jesus is the work of a lifetime...Being a disciple is not just something else to do, it is a total way of life and requires continuing conversion." (National Conference of Catholic Bishops, Stewardship a Disciple's Response (Dec. 21,1992). p. 14

Stewards can strive for many different characteristics in their pursuit to follow Jesus. The important ten are identified as **prayer**, **humility**, **trust**, **patience**, **responsibility**, **gratitude**, **generosity**, **simplicity**, **mercy**, **and perseverance**.

As a vital part of stewardship each characteristic has challenges, but they are connected to the virtue of love. Love calls for a conversation of heart, mind and soul. This commitment is inspired by grace and motivated by love and nourished with the Eucharistic.

The Angelus, Explained


The incarnation of Christ changed the life of every Christian person who ever lived. Reflecting on that moment in salvation history is an opportunity for grace, growth and peace. Who wouldn't want that every day, or even three times every day?

The Angelus is composed of three antiphons which narrate the annunciation, each followed by the recitation of a Hail Mary (a prayer that itself contains the "angelic greeting" of the angel Gabriel). Its name is derived from the first words of the prayer in Latin.

This devotion was developed over the course of several centuries and is rooted in the ancient practice of saying three Hail Marys in the evening.

Historically, people were called to prayer by the ringing of church bells — "the Angelus bells." Most people who recite the Angelus do so daily at 6:00am, noon and 6:00pm. ©LPi

Everyday Stewardship




Today's Gospel reading from John recounts the familiar story of the wedding feast at Cana when Jesus launched His public ministry by performing His first miracle at his mother's request.

In the midst of the feast, the Blessed Mother noticed that the wine had run out and pointed out the problem to Jesus. Then, she gave the servants instructions that are equally applicable to us modern-day stewards, saying, "Do whatever He tells you." Jesus gives the servants a simple and seemingly mundane task, telling them to fill some stone jars with water. They did what He told them to do. And Jesus used their obedience in the accomplishment of that simple task to perform His first miracle, turning the water into the choicest wine.

Our Lord didn't have to include those servants in order to perform this miracle — He chose to. And today, 2,000 plus years later, He still chooses to include us in the performance of His miracles through our cooperation with Him in using the gifts and talents He has given us. What a privilege! Let us take care to listen to our Blessed Mother: let's examine our lives this week to see if we really are "doing whatever He tells us," cooperating with God to make the best use of the gifts He has given us for the benefit of those around us. If we all take this call seriously, He will perform miracles in our families and our parish.

When St. Rose of Lima was born, her parents named her Isabel Flores de Olivia. As a little girl, she wanted to give her life to God. She was nicknamed "Rose" because of her beauty, and, at her confirmation, she decided "Rose" was going to be her name for good. St. Rose prayed everyday. She even prayed to God by deciding to do hard things and giving up some good things. To keep Jesus close to her, St. Rose would wear a silver, spiked crown. This reminded her of Jesus' crown of thorns. St. Rose lived in her parents' garden and helped her family by gardening and sewing. Today, St. Rose is the patron saint of South America, embroiderers, gardeners, and florists!


