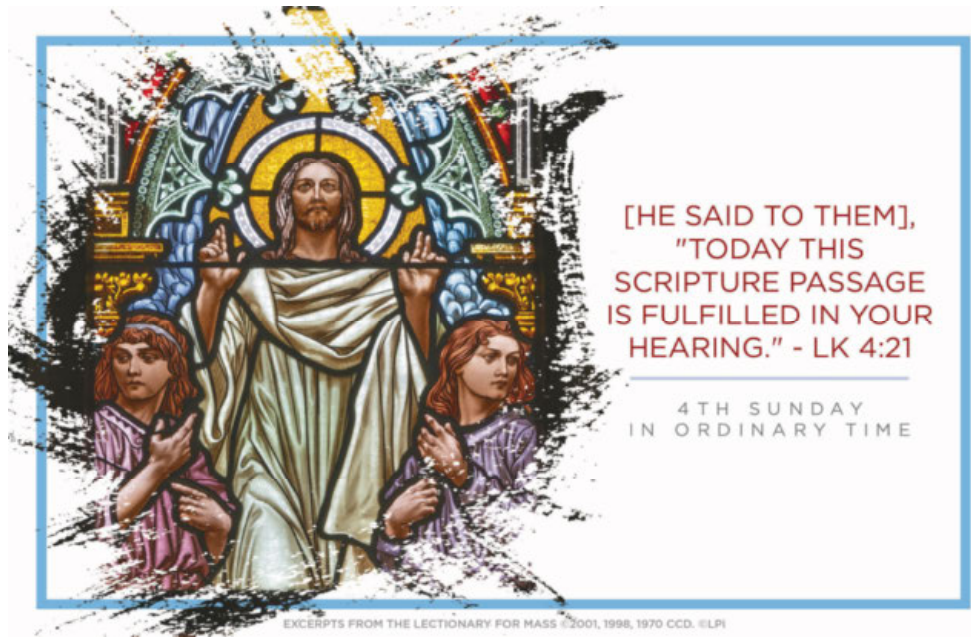

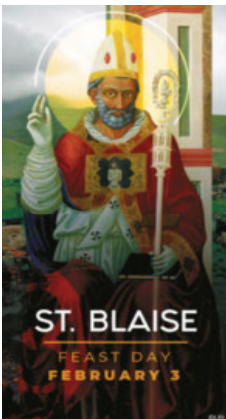

St. Blaise | February 3

You may be familiar with the annual "blessing of throats" that many parishes in the United States use to commemorate the beloved bishop and martyr. St. Blaise lived in the fourth century in Turkey and Armenia. Due to religious persecution, he was forced to flee and hide in a cave in the back country in order to save his life.

History has it that one day a group of hunters stumbled upon where St. Blaise was living. They found the bishop kneeling in prayer, surrounded by wolves, lions, and bears that he had tamed. The legend has it that as the hunters dragged Blaise off to prison, a mother came with her young son who had a fish bone lodged in his throat. At Blaise's command, the child was able to cough up the bone and thus lived.

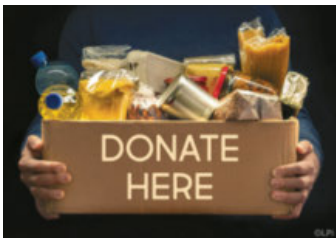

A Journey through Catholic Education

Janel (Ziegler) and I were introduced to Catholic education at a very early age as both of us had older siblings who attended the predecessor schools to TMP-Marian. Janel and her four sisters attended Marian High School/TMP-Marian with her oldest sister starting at Marian High School in 1975, and her youngest sister graduating from TMP-Marian in 1986. I had three brothers and one sister who also attended Catholic high schools with my oldest brother enrolling at St. Joseph's Military Academy in 1964, and me, as the youngest, graduating from Thomas More Prep in 1980. Although none of our parents graduated from either of these schools, they were all deeply devoted to the Catholic faith and quickly became committed to Catholic education. At that time, both schools were tuition based which required a financial sacrifice from our parents. It was not easy, to allow all their children to attend a Catholic high school. Their sacrifices resonated with Janel and me and we were determined to have our children also attend Catholic schools, if available. The formation of the Catholic middle school in 2012-2013, made it possible to send your children to Catholic schools from pre-kindergarten at Holy Family Elementary through high school at TMP-Marian. The financial commitment was also made easier as any practicing member of the local parishes are allowed to attend free of charge. Your tithing to the church replaced the tuition-based system previously noted.

As such, we had four children, Shaunna, Heather, Ryan, and Luke attend TMP-Marian with our oldest daughter, Shaunna graduating in 2011 and our youngest son, Luke graduating in 2018. Although there are many reasons we chose TMP-Marian, the primary factor is the learning and practicing of the Catholic faith. TMP-Marian reinforced what we tried to teach our children at home and we, in turn, tried to reinforce what the school taught. Another drawing factor was the historically strong education received at TMP-Marian as test scores continue to surpass the state's public school test score averages. We feel that TMP-Marian holds its students accountable academically, spiritually, and socially. Furthermore, the smaller class sizes allows for a better teacher-to-student ratio and encourages the students to become actively involved in various activities. Also, parental involvement and volunteerism are necessary for the school to survive, and we met so many of our children's friends and parents culminating in lasting friendships.

Our hope is that the school has provided a strong foundation for our children as they are continually challenged by today's society. Janel and I feel very fortunate that we, as well as our children, were able to attend Catholic schools, and we will continue to support their endeavors for years to come.
