## **Pastor's Notes**

### Why did Jesus insist on being baptized?

As we celebrate the Baptism of our Lord this Sunday we may ask the question above. We know that Jesus is God and thus is without sin, but He still insists that John baptize him in the Jordan River. This event is recorded in each of the Gospels placing its significance at the forefront of our understanding of the mission and identity of the person of Jesus.

Pope Benedict XVI has some beautiful insights into this great mystery. First, in antiquity water conjured up two distinct images: death and life. Benedict notes: "On the one hand, immersion into the waters is a symbol of death, which recalls the death symbolism of the annihilating, destructive power of the ocean flood. The ancient mind perceived the ocean as a permanent threat to the cosmos, to the earth; it was the primeval flood that might submerge all life . . . But the flowing waters of the river are above all a symbol of life (15-16)."

Even the physical act of baptism, especially baptism by immersion, represents death and new life: the descent into the waters is a form of death and burial; the rising to a new life is an icon of resurrection.

"Looking at the events (of Christ's baptism) in light of the Cross and Resurrection, the Christian people realized what happened: Jesus loaded the burden of all mankind's guilt upon his shoulders; he bore it down into the depths of the Jordan. He inaugurated his public activity by stepping into the place of sinners. His inaugural gesture is an anticipation of the Cross. He is, as it were, the true Jonah who said to the crew of the ship, "Take me and throw me into the sea" (Jon. 1:12) . . . The baptism is an acceptance of death for the sins of humanity, and the voice that calls out "This is my beloved Son" over the baptismal waters is an anticipatory reference to the Resurrection. This also explains why, in his own discourses, Jesus uses the word "baptism" to refer to his death (18)."

The Eastern traditions of iconography pick up on many of these themes, as the current pope emeritus elucidates:

"The icon of Jesus' baptism depicts the water as a liquid tomb having the form of a dark cavern, which is in turn the iconographic sign of Hades, the underworld, or hell. Jesus' descent into this watery tomb, into this inferno that envelops him from every side, is thus an anticipation of his act of descending into the underworld . . John Chrysostom writes: "Going down into the water and emerging again are the image of the descent into hell and the Resurrection" (19)."

Jesus is baptized to unite his humanity with ours, he takes on our humanity in all ways but sin. His baptism sanctifies the waters so that in our baptism we become united with Him. The death we enter into in baptism is also the resurrection, the new life we receive by the sacrament, made possible by Christ's death and resurrection as well.

The Catechism says in paragraph 537: Through Baptism the

Christian is sacramentally assimilated to Jesus, who in his own baptism anticipates his death and resurrection. The Christian must enter into this mystery of humble self-abasement and repentance, go down into the water with Jesus in order to rise with him, be reborn of water and the Spirit so as to become the Father's beloved son in the Son and "walk in newness of life". (Romans 6:4) Let us be buried with Christ by Baptism to rise with him; let us go down with him to be raised with him; and let us rise with him to be glorified with him. (St. Gregory of Nazianzus, Oratio 40, 9: PG 36, 369.)

Everything that happened to Christ lets us know that, after the bath of water, the Holy Spirit swoops down upon us from high heaven and that, adopted by the Father's voice, we become sons of God. (St. Hilary of Poitiers, In Matth. 2, 5: PL 9, 927)

## Reflections on Stewardship in light of the Gospel of Matthew

"Whoever loves father or mother more than me is not worthy of me, and whoever loves son or daughter more than me is not worthy of me, and whoever does not take up his cross and follow after me is not worthy of me...And whoever gives only a cup of cold water to one of these little ones to drink, because he is a disciple – amen, I say to you, he will surely not lose his reward." (Mt 10:37-42)

The first part of this passage from Matthew can seem harsh for those choosing to follow the Lord. It seems to require giving up almost everything. But, as in any major life commitment, you simply have to give some things up. Married persons relinquish some individual freedom, autonomous decision-making, total financial control. But they make that choice willingly because marriage is intended to give them things: Love, companionship, and family.

When I commit to being a follower of Christ, I have to give some things up as well: Some individual freedom, some of my money, perhaps some of the relationships that I have formed in my life. But a disciple makes that choice willingly because of the blessings that come with following Christ. So the opening words of Jesus in this passage should not trouble me. They are a call to live a wonderful life, to recognize what a gift it is to be so loved by the Lord...and to be able to love the Lord in return.

Stewardship is a leap of faith in real-life situations. Spend some quiet time with the Lord

## **Stewardship Reflection**



Today marks the close of the Christmas season, but before we return to Ordinary Time, we have one more great feast to celebrate — The Baptism of the Lord. Today's feast is a perfect opportunity to consider the privileges and responsibilities we all share as Christian stewards by virtue of our own Baptism.

At the moment of our Baptism we became adopted sons and daughters of God, members of his holy, Catholic Church. Though we may not have realized it, the moment of our Baptism is also the moment we become Christian stewards, disciples of Jesus Christ, tasked with the work of following in His footsteps day by day and sharing the Gospel message with all those around us.

In our second reading from the Acts of the Apostles, St. Peter gives us a glimpse of the person of Jesus we should imitate. "He went about doing good and healing all those oppressed by the devil, for God was with him." We must live our lives like Jesus, seeking to do good to everyone we encounter; not just those in our inner circle of family and friends, but everyone in our community since the Father loves us all and Jesus sought out everyone with His saving message.

In the Gospel passage from Matthew, we see yet another aspect of Jesus in action, this time as he humbly stands before John to be baptized by him. What humility and what willingness to unite Himself to us our Lord demonstrates by this act. We can do no less as we live out our daily lives as his disciples.

And when we do strive with all our might to live out our Baptismal call to Christian stewardship, we will experience the deep honor of knowing that our we, too, are God's "beloved" sons and daughters "with whom He is well-pleased."




