

STEWARDSHIP REFLECTIONS



Today, we celebrate the great feast of the Ascension of our Lord, that glorious moment when Jesus, 40 days after His resurrection, was lifted up — quite literally— into heaven, as the apostles watched in stunned amazement. It is recounted in both our first reading, from Acts, as well as the Gospel passage, from Matthew. It must have been an extraordinary

thing to witness.

But the first reading tells us that the apostles were not permitted to simply bask in the moment for very long. "While they were looking intently at the sky as he was going, suddenly two men dressed in white garments stood beside them. They said, 'Men of Galilee, why are you standing there looking at the sky?"

In other words, "Don't just stand there, do something!"

This verse is a call to each one of us Christian stewards this very day. We have been given every grace and blessing through the Mass and all of the sacraments, through the Word of God, the rich teachings of our faith, and even our talents and our material possessions.

And like those first apostles, we are not meant to just stand here, but to do something with these gifts — in love and gratitude to the One Who gave them to us. We are called, just as much as the first apostles "to be [His] witnesses... to the ends of the earth," not with our own power, but through the power of the Holy Spirit in us. — Stewardship Reflections by Catholic Stewardship Consultants



In light of the current state of our economy, the uncertainties caused by the COVID-19 pandemic, and the changes in the oil industry, our joint Finance Advisory Council and the administration of TMP-Marian and Holy Family Elementary have identified a substantial financial impact to our operating budget beginning next fiscal year, July 1, 2020.

First, the good news. We have been able to maintain our current budget and all staff has continued employment through the end of this fiscal year. The Monarchs have completed their semester with the level of spiritual, academic, and leadership excellence that is expected from TMP-Marian and Holy Family Elementary. In addition, the TMP-Marian Endowment is weathering this storm and is positioned to continue financial support to our mission of Catholic education, in accordance with the current funding policy and with minimal impact. Thanks be to the goodness of our almighty God and the generosity of many.

The financial impact our Catholic schools will experience is due to the projected decline in donations to the Heartland Parishes affecting their subsidies, St. Thomas More Society (STMS), Auction for Christian Education (ACE), among others. Simply stated, as our supporters are affected, we are affected. This impact will substantially impact our ability to fulfill our mission by attracting and retaining excellent staff and maintaining and improving our historical facilities.

Our ask of you is for your support of the funding arms mentioned above at the greatest level you are able. Currently, the STMS is 10% short of the \$650,000 2019-20 fiscal year goal and ACE 2020 has been rescheduled for July 18th and is more crucial than ever. Some may have yet to give, some may be able to give more, but please support to the level of your ability. For those that are unable to give, we understand and our prayers are for you. WHY DO WE DO THAT? Catholic Life Explained: Why Kneel?

Question: Why do we kneel at Mass?

Answer:

Since the beginnings of the Church, kneeling has been a key posture of prayer. We see Sts. Peter and Paul in the Acts of the Apostles kneeling in prayer. Early in the 4th century, the Council of Nicea prohibited kneeling on Sundays and special feasts. Kneeling began more as a posture of penance for our sins, but in the history of the Church, it has become more a posture or reverence and solemn prayer.

You will notice that the times we kneel at Mass are tied to the consecration of the holy Eucharist. We kneel in both anticipation of what will occur and then in awe of what has taken place: Jesus Christ becomes truly present to us under the guise of bread and wine. The profoundness of this event has over time led the Church to mandate in the current General Instruction of the Roman Missal that kneeling is the only posture allowed during this time. The sheer awesomeness of the holy Eucharist leads us to fall to our knees in wonder and thanksgiving.



There will be some appointments for screening as well as some informational ones for most of the week. All of this is to make sure that I am ready to go for the liver transplant, which will be May 22! There will be a couple of days in ICU and then some additional days in the transplant wing of the hospital. Once discharged from the hospital, I will spend 3-4 weeks at the Gift of Life Transplant House with my caregiver and other transplant recipients and their care givers. After that, I will return somewhere in KS to continue recovering for another 6 weeks or so. Finally, I will return to Colby for another year with all of you! Please continue to pray for me and my family, my donor and her family, (this is a huge sacrifice they are making) and for all of our doctors and caregivers.

I will keep you all updated as much as I can through my Facebook page and the parish Facebook page. I know some of you will be asking for an address where I am. I just ask to wait until the beginning of June to send anything, when I am settled in at the Gift of Life House. The address there is:
